Bill Richardson

Bill Richardson was born in Winnipeg on August 11, 1955. He received his B.A. from the University of Winnipeg in 1976. After spending a year in Montpellier, he moved to Vancouver where he completed a Master of Library Sciences. He then worked as children's librarian, before turning to writing and broadcasting. In 1998, Bill received a Honorary Doctor of Laws, from the University of Winnipeg.

Bill is well-known to CBC Radio audiences as a host on both Radio One and Radio Two. He's also made many freelance contributions to both network and regional shows including three documentaries for Ideas.

In 1992, Bill hosted a summer replacement show for Gabereau on Radio One, called **Crosswords**; that programme continued for four summers. In 1995, Bill came to Radio Two as the guest host of the classical music request show, RSVP, and was chosen as the show's new permanent host when it moved to Vancouver in January, 1996. The show was re-named **As You Like It**, to reflect Bill's interest in the music and letters of his audience.

In 1997, Bill was given Radio One's weekday afternoon timeslot, formerly occupied by Vicki Gabereau, and he became the host of a new programme, **Richardson's Roundup**. The Roundup is a mix of replays of some of the best CBC Radio excerpts from other programmes on Radio One and Radio Two, along with letters, music requests and other contributions from the listening audience. Bill 'wrangles the Roundup' with the skill, verve and humour one would expect from this multi-talented man.

In addition to his popularity as a broadcaster, Bill is a well-known columnist, writer and humourist. Bill has written ten books, including **The Bachelor Brothers Bed and Breakfast** which won the Stephen Leacock Medal for Humour in 1994 and was later serialized for broadcast on CBC Radio's **Between the Covers**.

Bill makes frequent public appearances reading poetry, narrating musical works, giving keynote speeches and signing books. In his spare time he reads, and tries to remember to drink a litre of water a day.
