<p>A repatriation policy</p> 	<p>Novice: Museum has not met the standard. Museum provides little evidence of meeting the performance expectation or learning goal. A written repatriation policy does not yet exist or is not clearly defined yet.</p>	
	<p>Approaching: Museum is approaching the standard. Museum demonstrates partial mastery of the standard. A written policy is available online. The museum is familiar with their current Indigenous Collection, and outlines whether or not they accept Indigenous items going forward.</p>	
	<p>Proficient: Museum has met the standard and demonstrates mastery of the standard. A written policy that was created in partnership with Indigenous community members. A clear process for repatriation that involves the Indigenous community and key staff members from the museum engaging in protocol.</p>	
	<p>Advanced understanding: Museum exceeds the standard and demonstrates exemplary understanding and implementation of the standard. A written repatriation policy, created in partnership with Indigenous partners, that is readily available online, responsive, and includes ownership of the burden and cost of this work. The policy recognizes access to information, collections and data as a foundational part of repatriation.</p>
